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INTEGRATION OF GLOBAL STANDARDS IN THE TRAINING OF POLICE OFFICERS IN THE PROCESS OF REFORMING THE MIA OF UKRAINE

Reforming the Ministry of Internal Affairs (MIA) of Ukraine is one of the key components of the process of modernization of state institutions and ensuring law and order. One of the important aspects of this process is the training of police officers, which must meet modern requirements and international standards. In the conditions of globalization, the integration of

world experience into the police training system becomes an integral component of successful reform. This scientific thesis examines the key aspects of the integration of international standards in the training of police officers in Ukraine, analyzes the existing models of training and offers recommendations for their implementation.

In global practice, there are various models of police training that take into account the specifics of national legislation, culture and traditions. One of the most successful examples are police training systems in the countries of the European Union, particularly in Germany and France. These countries use a multi-level education system, which includes theoretical classes, practical training and continuous professional development, which allows training highly qualified specialists.

The main focus is on the organization of training on the use of weapons, coercive means, situational training. It has been found out that during the exercises of firing proficiency not only the skills of marksmanship are worked out, but also various complex situational trainings are carried out, which reflect the situations of daily activities of the police and require them to take appropriate action. At the heart of all scenarios, there are nine standard police cases: police communication, personal identification, detention, search of persons, transportation of detainees, vehicle control, first medical aid, collection of materials for identification and its entry into the database, search of premises and belongings. While assessing the actions of a policeman in solving a situation, the trainers take into account: communication skills (both with the partner and with the “opponent”), tactics of action, compliance with the requirements of self-defence, the correct use of coercive means, the lawfulness of all measures taken, the provision of first medical care, achievement of a goal (solution of a situation) [1].

Training: The ENSP provide initial and continuous training of all chiefs of police and police officers from the national police. Every year, it also trains more than 250 foreign senior police officers. It prepares for the external competitive exams of chief of police and police officer, «deserving young people» eligible for equal opportunities in integrated preparatory classes. Partnership : The ENSP develops partnership training offers for

elected officials, private security executives, executives from public or semi-public institutions. It implements actions of international cooperation in association with European and international institutions in the field of security [2].

Today, our country is overcoming a difficult civilizational path - from the post-Soviet republic to an independent European state. He also knows about serious transformational processes law enforcement system. Let us define the main steps of police reform in Ukraine.

1. Recruitment, certification.
2. Development of patrol police units.
3. Creation of a road patrol police unit.
4. Implementation of patrol police response groups.
5. Creation of special purpose units - KORD.
6. Development of a network of situational centers.
7. Reforming the system of temporary detention centers.
8. Criminal Investigation – reform of the criminal police unit, creation of a service Detectives.
9. Creation of a single contact center "102".
10. Creation of mobile groups for response and prevention of violence in the family.

Currently, Ukraine is experiencing deep socio-economic and political changes. These fundamental changes in social and political life are associated with the reform of the judicial system, internal affairs bodies, formation of the National Police [3].

The integration of world standards in the training of police officers is critically important for the successful reform of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Ukraine. The study and implementation of the best international practices will allow training of highly qualified specialists capable of effectively ensuring law and order in modern conditions. The implementation of the recommended measures will help increase the level of trust in law enforcement agencies and ensure stability and security in Ukraine.
