Systems such as the Schengen Information System (SIS) and the European Arrest Warrant (EAW) facilitate real-time information sharing and streamlined extradition processes among EU member states. The SIS, which provides data on individuals and objects associated with criminal activities, has improved the ability of law enforcement agencies to track and apprehend suspects across borders [3].

Despite these advances, European states face growing challenges in combating crimes. The digital transformation has led to an increase in cyber-related offenses, with criminals exploiting advanced technology to commit fraud, identity theft, and ransomware attacks. Cybercrime is one of the fastest-growing types of crime in Europe, posing significant threats to both private citizens and public institutions. The complexity of these crimes requires continuous adaptation by law enforcement agencies, as well as substantial investment in digital infrastructure and cybersecurity training [2].
