NATIONAL POLICE ACTIVITY DURING MARTIAL LAW

The proposed strategy and tactics for combating organized crime in Ukraine are intended to play this role to some extent. They define a systematic approach to solving these problems, prioritize directions, and outline a set of main effective measures aimed at eliminating this negative phenomenon and the reasons and conditions that cause
