

4) These examples show that a successful fight against crime includes not only strict compliance with laws, but also support and rehabilitation programs, prevention, and instilling public trust in the rule of law. Investments in education and creating equal opportunities for young people also play an important role.

Evidence from the fight against crime in foreign countries shows that comprehensive approaches, including preventive interventions, rehabilitation and social support, are the most effective. Suvori laws and a high level of control (like in Singapore) can promote malignancy, but at the same time the edge of humane systems such as Norway and the Netherlands demonstrate that successful fight against violence is possible through integration and social support. This approach not only reduces the level of malice, but also encourages trusting relationships between citizens and law enforcement agencies, which ensures a stable and safe marriage. Evidence from other countries may be instrumental in strengthening comprehensive approaches to combating scourges, including strengthening prevention, investing in public health, and developing resocialization programs. This allows for the creation of a comprehensive strategy that addresses both the needs of marriage and the importance of individual support for potential offenders.

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EXPERIENCE OF FIGHTING TERRORISM IN THE USA

The definition of terrorism is controversial. There is debate as to whether terrorist incidents must be random, cause fear in the public, or be committed by an organization, among other issues. Despite these differences, many definitions of terrorism require that perpetrators plan and commit a violent ideologically motivated crime (Schmid & Jongman 1988) [1].

On June 12, 2016, Omar Mateen carried out a terrorist attack at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, killing 49 people and injuring 53. After the first shots were fired, police responded quickly, with officers taking up

positions around the club and SWAT teams entering the building to evacuate the victims. Mateen barricaded himself in the bathroom with hostages and threatened to blow himself up, declaring his allegiance to the Islamic State. Law enforcement officers negotiated with him while organizing the evacuation. When the threat to the hostages increased, the police decided to storm the premises: armored vehicles broke through the walls of the club, which allowed them to free the people. After a shootout, the attacker was eliminated. In Orlando, law enforcement officers acted professionally and selflessly, confronting terrorists and saving lives. They quickly formed teams to localize and neutralize the threat, risking themselves for the safety of others. Thanks to their thorough training, their actions helped prevent further violence and save lives [2].

On December 2, 2015, in San Bernardino, terrorists Syed Farook and Tashfeen Malik opened fire on their colleagues, killing 14 people and wounding 22. Police arrived within minutes of the call. The first officers quickly formed contact teams, entered the building, and began searching for the attackers, overcoming numerous obstacles such as a blood-filled floor and loud noise. They worked under pressure to rescue victims and ensure safety despite limited resources. After a grueling pursuit, the terrorists were neutralized and the threat was eliminated [2].

In Orlando and San Bernardino, law enforcement officers acted professionally and selflessly to confront the terrorists and save lives. They quickly formed teams to localize and neutralize the threat, putting themselves at risk for the safety of others. Thanks to their thorough training, their actions helped prevent further violence and rescue victims [2].

In summary, the US police have been highly effective in the fight against terrorism due to their rapid response, emergency preparedness, and teamwork. U.S. law enforcement officers have demonstrated a willingness to risk their own lives to save citizens, acting on well-developed tactics and adapting them to the situation. However, the experience of dealing with terrorist threats also reveals the need for improved equipment and better coordination of resources between agencies. In general, the work of the US police demonstrates a significant level of professionalism, but requires constant development to maintain public safety in the face of new challenges.

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
