This approach, supported by the European Union Advisory Mission (EUAM) in Ukraine, focuses on building constructive relationships between police officers and the communities they serve, particularly in areas affected by conflict. In Ukraine, community policing initiatives have been crucial in post-conflict recovery, as they emphasize transparency, active listening, and responsiveness to community concerns. By establishing open lines of communication, law enforcement agencies are better able to understand and address local issues, prevent escalation, and reduce tensions within communities. This model not only reduces crime but also empowers citizens to feel actively engaged in their own security, reinforcing community cohesion and resilience [2].

Organized crime poses complex risks to public order, given its transnational reach and impact on economic and social stability. Ukraine, as a transit and trade hub, faces specific vulnerabilities to organized crime,
